

Quick Release Toe Saver Instructions

Instructions? How complicated is this? Not very, but even smart people sometimes make mistakes.

Installation

1. Unscrew the existing toe saver.
2. Screw in the quick release toe saver.
3. To remove the quick release pin, push the button at the top of the pin and pull it out. You won't be able to remove it without pushing the button, unless you lock the Toe Saver in a vise, and are stronger than I can imagine.
4. To reinstall the quick release pin, push the button at the top of the pin and push it back in.

Use & Warnings

To make sure that you don't misplace the pin, put a cord through the lanyard loop, and tie it to some part of your mount. This way you won't put it in a coat pocket and later wonder where it went.

I have tested this device by allowing a 15-pound counterweight to fall the entire length of the shaft with the shaft screw completely loose, so it was falling with effectively no friction. The Quick Release Toe Saver survived multiple drops without failure and even without apparent damage. Repeatedly doing this, however, is rather like putting a loaded handgun to your head and pulling the trigger, knowing that the safety is on. Don't be stupid.

Warning: It is impossible to imagine every bizarre and irrational way in which users will use and misuse this gadget. I'm sure that someone, somewhere, will decide to put 100 pounds of counterweights on their mount, all the way at the top of the counterweight shaft, and then loosen the only screw holding any of the weights in position. While I believe that the Quick Release Toe Saver would survive this form of abuse, it might not survive this repeatedly. Consequently: **The customer is responsible for appropriate and sensible use of this product. ScopeRoller is not responsible for consequential damages caused by use or misuse of this product, and ScopeRoller is responsible only for replacement of the Quick Release Toe Saver in the event of failure within one year of purchase. Like all safety devices, the customer should not rely upon this as the sole means of protecting your toes, children, pets, and telescope.**
